PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mission Possible 2019

The 2019 Mission Possible will be held on Saturday, June 15 from 1 pm to 5 pm in the park on the north side of the community centre. There is no charge for this event. There is free entertainment and free burgers plus bouncy castle and a members-only beer garden (so bring you membership card). Membership cards and history books are available for purchase. This is a big event which needs lots of volunteers helping on the day of the event. Set up is at 10 am and take down is at 5 pm. If you can help, contact cbmca.socialevents@gmail.com.

City Open House on 2nd Street SW

The City of Calgary is holding an open house on possible changes to 2nd Street SW. As you know, there were consultations last fall. There were two scenarios on changes to better accommodate bicycle travel on 2nd Street. One scenario kept the two-way motor vehicle travel and one scenario reverted 2nd Street back to one way going north. It took us 10 years to get our one-way streets changed to two-way and 91% of respondents to the City survey did not support the one-way north scenario. The date for this consultation is yet to be decided but may occur some time in June. Sign up for email updates from us to be informed of the date. We urge you to attend this open house to ensure they don't change it back to one-way motor vehicle traffic.

Community Check-In

The last Community Check-in was done in 2016. We have just gone through a land use redesignation for Riverwalk, a 12-storey development at 25th Avenue and 5th Street SW, which we did not support. Some people stated that we did not represent the community as a whole on that matter and dismissed the 2016 consultation. We know otherwise but we believe it would strengthen our position if we held another Community Check-In. We will be faced with other such proposals in the future such as the Fishman's site at 17th Avenue and 5A Street SW and the Safeway site. We want to ensure we can demonstrate that we do reflect and represent the community as a whole. Thus, we are working on an online survey. We will e-mail our members and use social media to let you know how you can participate. We urge you to attend this very important community consultation.

Update on Safeway Site

When I was out in Vancouver in April, I took some pictures of a Safeway site that, before redevelopment, was



similar to our Safeway site—a similar-sized store with a big parking lot. It is located at Granville Street and 70 Avenue (towards the airport). We know that when economic conditions are right from the land owner point of view, there will be proposal to redevelop our Safeway site. It most likely will propose one or more high rise buildings. The Vancouver Safeway site has three buildings: one 19 storeys that houses the Safeway store and a Safeway parking lot, one 14 storeys and one seven storeys. The residential area to the west of that complex is mostly single-family housing.

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"Near Here" Pilot Project coming to 4th St & 17th Ave

This summer, the neighbourhood will be hosting a new community-building project—an interactive community way-finding board called "Near Here". Created with the intention of making Calgary more walkable, Near Here combines exploration and human interaction, resulting in organic wayfinding to help pedestrians discover what's 'near here' in the neighbourhood. The board's aim is to encourage active transportation, leverage community knowledge, and activate a space within the community.

The Near Here board is a physical, analog chalkboard (around 6.5ft high and 4ft wide) that will be mounted into the sidewalk. People will be invited to engage and interact with the board in order to create a living wayfinding system for a neighbourhood. The Near Here project began at the City of Calgary's 2018 Pedestrian Hackathon. The project won the "Play" category at the Hackathon and went on to receive a grant from the Alberta Traffic Safety Fund to bring the concept to life. With the support of the City of Calgary and four of Calgary's communities, the Near Here pilot project is taking place between May and August 2019. The team is comprised of three current and former MRU Information Design students and a transportation engineer, working to bring the pilot project to the streets (or more accurately, the sidewalks) of Calgary!

During the team's first test on Stephen Avenue, they noticed 'the board sparked story-telling as a conversation starter with the potential to build community'. We're hoping the same happens in Mission. Make sure to check it out this summer and give or receive some tips for our neighbourhood. The project welcomes self-moderation, so if you see something out of date or offensive don't feel shy about erasing content.

Rouleau House, 141 18 Avenue SW

Work is underway for the restoration of one of Mission's most iconic historic houses. Named for Calgary pioneer Dr. Édouard-Hector Rouleau, who lived there with his family from 1887 to 1902, the Queen Anne revival house has been empty since 2003, when it was acquired by the city. The exterior will be completely restored, and the interior rehabilitated for adaptive re-use as offices for Alberta Ballet. We are working on a feature story on the house and its restoration for a newsletter later this summer.

Heritage Plaque Program

You may have noticed a round blue plaque on homes around the neighbourhood and buildings such as the Yale (2121 5 Street SW) and Laurence (5 Street and 24 Avenue SW) apartments. The CBMCA initiated this program to recognize historic homes in our neighbourhood. The plaque does not denote official historic status, rather it indicates that the building is celebrated and valued by the community. There is no charge to the homeowner, and we facilitate the plaques' installation by professionals.

Location:

2201 Cliff St. SW

Capacity:

The hall has two areas, which can be used as one big hall or divided by a rolling partition. Both parts together can fit 104 people standing or 80 seated (sufficient chairs and tables for 80 are included in the rental).

Facilities:

Kitchen with stove, oven, fridge and microwave (dishes, utensils, coffeemaker, kettle, etc. not provided). There is also a wet bar with double fridge with glass doors. There is a big screen to use for presentations/films (projector not provided).

Restrictions:

Smoking and the consumption of alcohol are not permitted in the hall.

Rental fees:

\$200 for either 9 am to 4 pm (except during school days) or from 5 pm to 11 pm. The rate is reduced to \$120 per rental if renting 12 or more times per year. There is also a charity rate of \$75 per rental for charitable organizations with charitable number.

Girl Greatness Starts Here!

New Public Space "Coming Soon" to 17th Avenue SW

An innovative new public space will soon be complete on the city's beloved uptown 17th Avenue. The transformation of a long-neglected corner on 17th Avenue and 5a Street SW broke ground last fall and the finishing touches—seating!—can be expected this spring/summer.

The Bench Project—a local community group comprised of young planners and designers—championed the project, in partnership with the Cliff Bungalow-Mission Community Association. In 2017, the citizen-driven initiative successfully obtained funding through the Council Innovation Fund due to its unique approach to creating public space in a dense neighbourhood where land can be prohibitively expensive to acquire.

The Bench Project and the Cliff Bungalow-Mission Community Association saw an invaluable opportunity to retrofit a gravel-filled space on this corner, located next to Western Canada High School, for the benefit of a community. While

the city lacks free spaces for people to linger and observe public life on the street. Members of The Bench Project subscribe to the viewpoint of well-known urbanist William Whyte, who pointed out, 'What attracts people most, it would appear, is other people.' When accessible, affordable communal spaces are located along busy pedestrian corridors, chance encounters with neighbours and friends become more likely. As a result, communities are strengthened, becoming more connected and more resilient.

The plan was conceived four years ago. 'From the begin-

Calgary has a significant amount of park and patio space,

The plan was conceived four years ago. 'From the beginning, the Calgary Board of Education and Western Canada High School have been on board, recognizing this as a unique opportunity for both students and the street. We have been blown away by how much support they have shown for this project', notes Kate Zago, a founding member of The Bench Project and board member of the Cliff Bungalow-Mission Community Association. In addition to the CBE and Western, The Bench Project was grateful to receive support from the 17th Avenue Business Revitalization Zone (BRZ), which has generously agreed to assist with maintenance, and the Calgary Parks Foundation who contributed additional capital to the ensure the full project design could be realized. Zago further notes that, 'this project wouldn't have been possible without the endless hours and resources provided by so many different community groups, local organizations and institutions. It really demonstrates how lucky we are to call this city our home.'

Numerous engagement sessions with community members and Western Canada High School students informed and shaped the design for the 17th Avenue Pocket Square. A number of students—the Grade 12 art class—even had a hand in the project, creating a mural with the help of Daniel Kirk, a local artist. 'Involving the community and students has been an important component of the project for us,' says Kate Zago. "We want to ensure the space responds to the needs of the local community as well as the city at large. As it exists today, 17th Avenue SW acts as a meeting grounds for all Calgarians, and this small but powerful project strives to ensure this legacy continues for decades to come."

An opening celebration will be held in the spring/summer so stay tuned for further news on the Cliff Bungalow-Mission website.

About Wine features wines not typically on one's shopping radar; Unique wines with a story - of people, place or style. It tells of artisans making reasonably priced wines (under \$50 retail) all the while demonstrating careful Earth consideration.

2017 Henri Cruchon, Le Morget Sélection (LMS) La Côte

(www.henricruchon.com)

About the Canton: Domaine Henri Cruchon rests on the shores of Lac Léman, 10 km west of Lausanne in the French-speaking canton of Vaud, Switzerland.

On the eastern slope of the Jura Mountains, it lies at 500 metres above sea level at latitude parallel to Burgundy, France.

About the Grape: Chasselas (Chas-a-la) is Vaud's signature grape. Native to the canton, this white has been grown here since the 16th century.

About the Maker: The placeholder of a multi-generation family operation, Henri Cruchon has been instrumental in the revival of the domestic wine industry. Recognizing both the potential in cool weather wines, and the understated profile of Switzerland viticulture, he is helping bring international attention to Swiss wine commerce.

Now in his 80s, Henri has transitioned daily operations to sons Raoul and Michel, as well as granddaughters Catherine (Oenologist) and Yaëlle (Viticulturist).

About the Vineyard: Farming 42-hectares outside the town of Morges, the family applies biodynamic principles to its 100+ small vineyard parcels. Applying gentle, hands-on methodology—including sheep grazing, hand harvesting and spontaneous fermentation to the winemaking mix - allows for rapid intervention into the daily/yearly challenges of alpine wine production.

About Terroir: Lake-influenced high-altitude continental climate, in combination with sloping alpine terrain, and a mix of calcium-based soils, contribute unique/distinct attributes to the wines of Henri Cruchon.
