age closet. The other thing that is very bad for the finish is the use of any type of tape on the floor. That will no longer be allowed. See the picture of the refinished floor and you will understand why we want to take better care of this beautiful and historic hardwood floor.



There is an interesting story about how we discovered the hardwood floor in our hall. When we took over this space in 1988 to serve as our community centre hall, we took out the wall between two classrooms. In the process we discovered there were layers of floor. On top was linoleum. Underneath that was plywood. Then there was this beautiful hardwood floor. Most likely the Calgary Board of Education decided that the hardwood floor was too hard to keep up, and covered it with something more practical. Anyway, later we decided to uncover the layers on the west side and have been using it ever since then.

# The Laurence **Apartments**

Corner of 24 Avenue and 5 Street SW

One of the reasons Cliff Bungalow-Mission is one of Calgary's great neighbourhoods is the wealth of heritage and character homes. After all, there is more than 145 years of history in our small corner of the city. Join us here each month for a look into some of our most iconic homes and apartments (which are homes, too, after all).

On the southeast corner is one of Cliff Bungalow-Mission's most sought-after apartment buildings: the Laurence Apartments. Built in 1929 by Arthur Himmelman, the Laurence is one of Calgary's few examples of California garden apartment-inspired design. Each of the 12 suites in this two-storey, wood frame and stucco building has its own front and back entrance. The Craftsman-style interiors feature hardwood floors and solid fir mantles and plate rails.

Himmelman named the Laurence after his son, who would live in the building for many years. Katie Grinham is Himmelman's granddaughter, Laurence's daughter. She and her sisters retain both buildings.

"These buildings are a part of my family's heritage and the community's heritage."

## **What's Trending** in Fitness?

When we are looking for a different shopping experience, we change the way we shop. This means driving past the mall to avoid the crowded parking lot and busy stores and heading to a boutique shop. Over the past several years this practice has been reflected in how we approach fitness. The rise of boutique gyms is giving people a different fitness experience.

At a fitness conference I attended this trend was the buzz. We are moving from the "all services in one" gym model to specialized and focused services, also known as boutique gyms. These gyms are small, provide group fitness classes and focus one or two areas in fitness. Barre, yoga, spin, boxing, circuit HIIT, are examples of the type of boutique fitness studios that you will find in different neighbourhoods in Calgary.

So, what's the draw?

Back in the day, I attended a small women's-only gym. What they lacked in cardio and weight equipment they made up in great fitness classes that cultivated a sense of community among members. This is what kept me going, the feeling of being connected with others who also enjoyed getting a challenging workout. I imagine this is part of the draw to boutique gyms. In addition to the social environment, people enjoy charismatic instructors, an exceptional workout atmosphere, and motivating music. These characteristics provide enough incentive for people to pay a bit more, approx. \$20-30/ class, to participate in a trendy fitness experience that their local gym may not offer.

It's clear that boutique gyms meet a need for people who are looking for a different fitness experience or looking to add to their current routine. Looking to try a boutique gym? 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
