



Invitation to Provide Feedback On 2nd **Street SW Bike Lanes**

This summer, The City of Calgary will be doing work along 2 Street SW by upgrading the existing shared driving and cycling lane to a painted dedicated bike lane and installing curb extensions on the street to make it safer for people to cross the road. These changes will take place between 26 Avenue to 10 Avenue SW and work will begin later this summer.

The work is being done to improve the walking and cycling experience in our community and the Beltline, provide better access and connections to key destinations in this area, and connect to the existing cycle track and pathway system.

Reader Rock Garden Receives Special Designation

The Minister of Environment and Climate Change and Minister responsible for Parks Canada, Catherine McKenna, announced the designation of 12 new nationally significant persons, places and events that helped define Canada's history. This new designation includes Calgary's own Reader Rock Garden:

"I am very proud to recognize some of the persons, places and events that have shaped our country. Designations can recall moments of greatness and triumph or cause us to contemplate the complex and challenging moments that helped define Canada today. By sharing these stories with Canadians, we hope to foster better understanding and open discussions on Canada's history." - The Honourable Catherine McKenna, Minister of Environment and Climate Change and Minister responsible for Parks Canada

This once barren hill started off in 1913 as the private residence of Calgary's Superintendent of Parks, Cemeteries & Recreation. William Roland Reader and his family lived there for almost 30 years, crafting their surrounding landscape into the oasis it is today. The garden was named in Mr. Reader's honour upon his passing and has been a public park since 1944.

The application process began in December 2014, with a document submitted for consideration. After doing their own research, Parks Canada acknowledged the importance of Calgary's Reader Rock Garden: "Its aesthetic and scientific values as one of Alberta's premier public gardens and a significant botanical testing ground were chief components in this process." It's significant for its association with the garden's designer, internationally known horticulturalist, botanist and landscape designer: W.R. Reader.


Reader Rock Garden demonstrates many important attributes: an expression of multiple horticultural styles,

gardening trends and botanical diversity; its connection to the Euro-Canadian settlement of Western Canada, which Reader supported through his experimentation with plant material, public education, and promotion of Calgary as a desirable place to settle; and finally, its ecological prominence as a garden that was renowned for its diversity and achievements.

Reader's great grandson, David Peacock, was elated to hear the news, as were other members of Reader's extended family:

"When I heard of the National Historic Designation of Reader Rock Garden, I immediately thought of my father, the late Bill Peacock (grandson of William Reader); and of my father's stories of living with, and carefully collecting flowers and seed specimens while on hikes with 'Grandaddy Reader'. My father had tremendous respect for this pioneering Parks Superintendent and I can imagine the immense pride Bill Peacock would be feeling upon this wonderful recognition of Canadian heritage."

We should personally take the time to celebrate this honour. Perhaps this should be the year to finally explore the Garden or revisit it again.
